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#### 1. Overview

For the first time this year, Building Plymouth and Building Greater Exeter joined forces for a collaborative 'Construction Zone' at Big Bang South West. We welcomed industry professionals to join the zone and as a collective hosted a range of design, engineering and building challenges in both the inside and outside areas.

The Big Bang Fair South West 2019 reached in the region of 6,000 visitors and welcomed students from 96 schools from Devon, Cornwall, Somerset, Dorset and Wiltshire.

#### 2. Overall Summary of visitors


#### 2.1 Summary of visitors to the Big Bang:

- The total number of visitors to Big Bang was 5,300 (This doesn't include all other visitors- guests, VIPs, STEM Ambassadors)
- Schools: 63 secondary, 33 primary.










# 2.4 Distribution of visitors Registered:








#### 5. Dressing

As a backdrop for the Construction Zone we have created and invested in large inspirational panels which can be used for future events:













- The layout of the construction zone was planned precisely to ensure visitor flow, and good line up with the backdrops behind
- In the centre of the zone we created a scaffolding tower, with banners at the top encouraging visitors, a TV in the centre, and a careers information table at the bottom.
- We created a compilation of time lapse footage from contractors of local construction sites which played on the TV in the centre of the zone
- When visitors then went through to our outdoors zone they were given hard hats and Hi-Viz vests to wear, which was particularly popular with younger visitors





#### 6. Awards

- The Big Bang Competition recognises and rewards young people's achievements in all areas of science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM), whilst providing them with the opportunity to build their skills and confidence in project-based work. The South West regional awards were presented during the event.
- Part of Building Plymouth and Building Greater Exeter's joint sponsorship of the event involved Matthew Cousins (Apex Scaffolding and Chair of Building Greater Exeter) presenting the award for STEM Club Project of the Year. The winning team were from Maiden Beech Academy





#### 10. Big Bang 2020

**SAVE THE DATE** – Next year the event will be over two days in the same venue:



#### Our reflections and ideas for next year include:

- Visitor arrivals: We will advise that coaches arriving to the venue should be managed in a better way so that visitors could utilise the outdoor activities before entering the venue
- Helpers: Given a clear role and responsibility for the day, with allocated break time. Helpers also help connect people to activities, introduce them and ensure a steady flow
- Signage: We will have clearer signage to the outdoor area to encourage more visitors and better 'flow' through to the outside area.
- Clothing: To make the event organisers more distinctive, black polo shirts with the Building Plymouth or Building Greater Exeter logo could be worn
- Central activity: Following its success and popularity we would like to move the 'Build a town' activity to the centre of the Construction Zone
- No pop-ups: Our Joining Instructions will more clearly state that there is a no pop-up rule which applies to every organisation. This is due to the backdrops being designed for the event to maximise visitor interest.
- No branded tablecloths: We will provide all tablecloths (plain black fabric)
- Video: Time-lapse footage of local construction projects will be played throughout the day- but will find a way to stop or reduce any IT issues so that it plays continually
- Outdoor activity location: We would like to move some or all outdoor activities to the space directly outside of the Construction Zone- this will depend on approval from the venue organisers.
- Exhibitor feedback: To ensure we get feedback from every exhibitor and helper, we will ask feedback forms to be filled on the day
- Exit: When exhibitors leave the venue, the traffic needs to be managed so that there is not a big delay
