The last year has made us question and examine every aspect of how we do business within our own companies. The same process has taken place within CECA Southern and all other CECA regions. There has been a real focus on how we deliver training and other members' services, particularly by coordinating with other regions.

Whilst it is often good to have face to face meetings there is a realisation that in many cases remote training and interaction do work well and are better for our carbon footprint. The most important point is that members' services are provided in the best and most efficient way possible.


