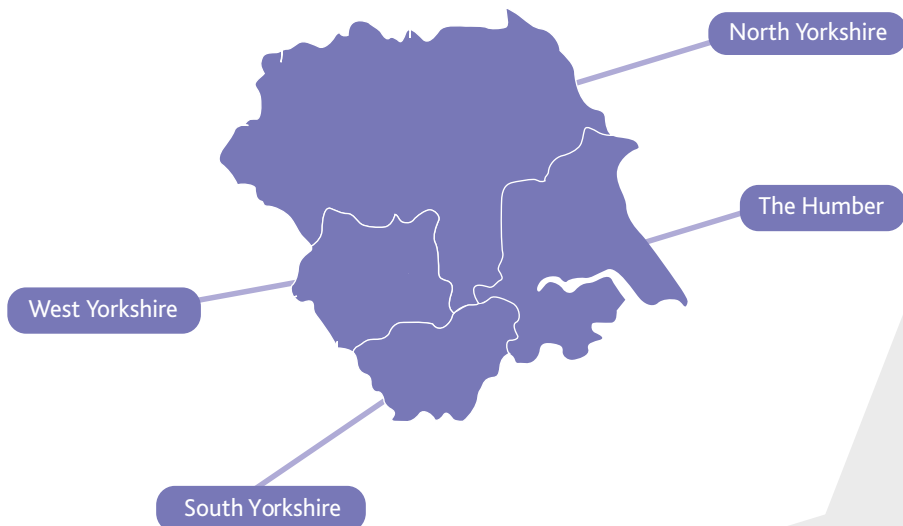

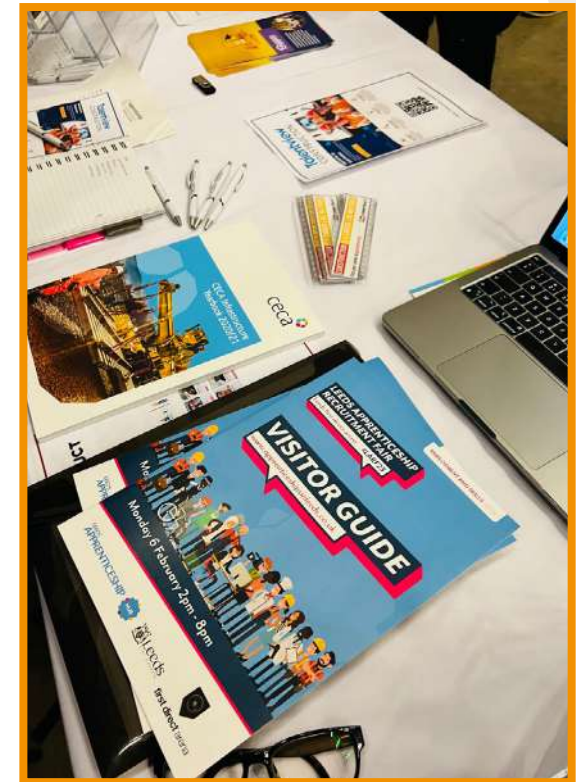
CECA and National Highways provided hands-on construction activities as part of the 'Give Construction a Try' event at Castleford College in May, 2023.
